Multiple Learning Pathways

Revitalization of Learning Methods

- Core French Focus: innovative delivery methods, increasing motivation and retention.
- French Immersion Focus: exemplary practices across Canada, recruitment and retention in secondary programs.
- ESL: Time and intensity allocations
- Innovative approaches and multiple pathways to learning.

Recognizing Language Competencies

- Need broader measures of assessment to motivate and recognize learners.
- Framework of Reference for Languages
 - CEFR
- Language Proficiency Tracking System
 - ELP
- Recognition / Certificate

Training, Recruitment and Retention of Qualified Teachers

- Clear expectations for linguistic, cultural and methodological competences for teachers.
- Effective and flexible opportunities to support teacher learning throughout their careers.
- Knowledge exchange facilitation of information and idea exchanges.

Identifying Priorities for Research

- Criteria: Relevance, Audiences, Purposes, Impacts
- Results: Measures of Change, Evidence, Future Orientation, Improvement Focus
- Appropriate Funding Amounts, Timeframes, Recipients
- Consider Mid to Long Term Projects
- Methods to Communicate Priorities

Consider the Relevance

- Community Relevance
- International Relevance
- Relevance for affecting positive change in practices / behaviour and attitudes

Knowledge Centres, Research Networks

- Government Funders Researchers Institutions Users
- Identify experts as research team leaders, establish multi-skill teams, cross-institutions
- Clear roles and responsibilities
- Consider models e.g., Council of Europe and ECML (Graz, Austria), Centres of Excellence, Health Sciences Networks, Cdn Council on Learning
- Central coordination and staffing, creating an Official Languages Research Network.

Establishing Communication Networks, Dissemination

- Begin by valuing the communication of research and connectivity to public.
- Feature relevance and end use of research results
- Promote exchanges between researchers
- Encourage annual meetings of multi perspectives.
- Consider accessibility, clearinghouse approach.

Dissemination ...

- Be inclusive and equitable in consultation networks.
- Effectively communicate existing knowledge and research.
- Effectively popularize research, socially responsive methods
- Encourage mechanisms for monitoring progress, evaluating impacts, reporting, identifying and eliminating barriers.

Importance of Linguistic Duality for Official Languages

- Strengthened bilingual allophone and anglophone majority facilitates participation in and support for French cultural activities and thus encourages the potential growth and vitality of francophone community settings.
- "Rapprochement" opportunities between communities supports and builds on prior learning completed, and recognizes the multiple pathways in developing competencies in French throughout life.
